tell us your thoughts on the Project – on page 4.

So, when the 'Befriending through Sport' project is up and running we will have three projects working to combat the effects of loneliness and isolation for disabled and vulnerable people. This means that we our work will have a significant impact on those people in the Whitby area.

I recently came across a report – **'No Place Like Home'** – on the Leonard Cheshire website. This report contained some shocking statistics:

- Only 5% of homes in England can be visited by someone in a wheelchair
- 1 in 6 disabled adults live in housing that isn't suitable for their needs
- 75% of British adults live in a home without an accessible front door.

The report calls on the Government to make Lifetime Homes* the minimum standard for all new-built homes. *Lifetime Homes have 16 design criteria that can be applied to new homes with an average cost of £1,100 or less. The Government and housebuilders are resisting this, so, if you have an opportunity, over the build up to the Election, to speak to our local parliamentary candidates, this may be something you would like to ask them about.

If, like me, you love football, you may have seen that Whitby Town has been successful in obtaining funding to get DAG to do some further access work. They have some good facilities in the new stand for disabled people, and this work will improve those and also access to the Club House. Finally, two very different reminders.

Please come along to our **Coffee Morning** on 4th **March**, **10am-12.30pm** here at **Church House Centre**, to meet representatives of **Hambleton**, **Richmondshire & Whitby Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG)**. They want to hear what local disabled people think about the proposed developments for **Whitby Community Hospital** and **Community Health Services**.
